


From the Academic Coordinator MBA32



















From the Academic Coordinator

To add to the diversity and dynamism, moreover, this year the RMS group was joined by 16 DBA candidates from MSM's partner institution CENTRUM Colombia. Participants indicated that they found the program demanding and intense, but ultimately very worthwhile and rewarding. The combination of a particularly rigorous introduction to conceptual modeling with elaborate, but hands-on and skills-oriented, modules on qualitative and quantitative methods that drive participants to really get the most out of themselves and their research ideas remains a unique asset of MSM's approach to teaching research methods and skills. The steep accumulation of knowledge and capacities over the three-month period that the course entails was evident for the RMS lecturing team and also for participants themselves. Facilitating committed researchers in finding their focus, developing their problem statement and building up their academic confidence is a gratifying process. The moment at which candidates have a full-fledged research proposal in their hands that they then defend with zeal in an official ceremony is a significant event for both candidates and lecturers. It signifies the culmination of months of fruitful frustration, close cooperation and mutual learning. It is this rewarding process and its solid outcomes that convince all of us each year anew that the insights and skills from MSM's RMS course will boost any career - whether it is in management, business, research, development or public administration - as well as enrich the intellectual life of our participants.

We wish you success and good luck in the further development of your career and do not forget MSM in that process!


